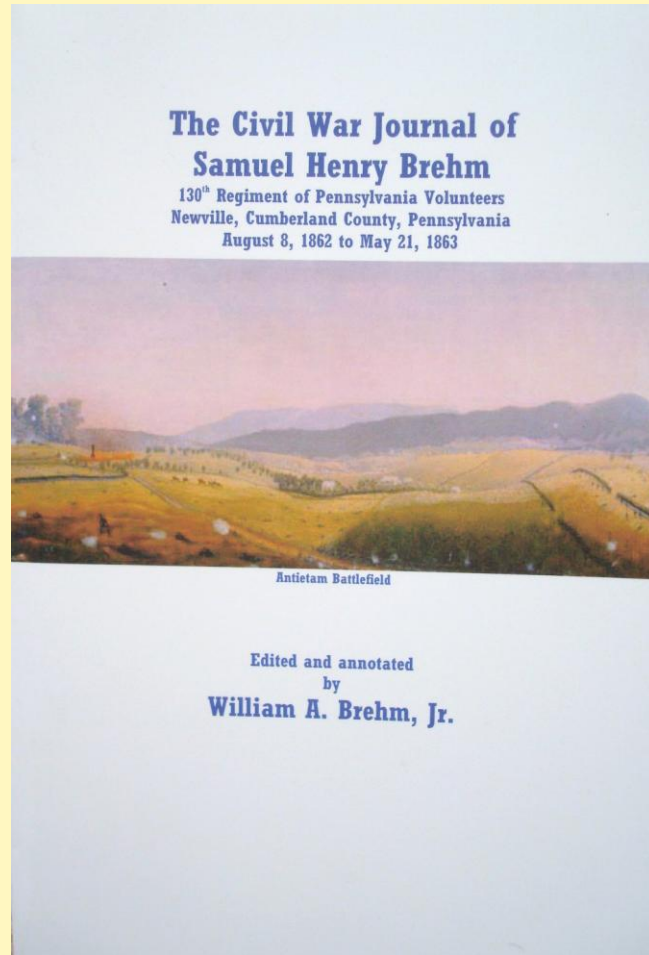

The American Civil War, a time of great agony for the young country, remains a subject of fascination today not only for historians, but for every American, and others throughout the world.

While there are many letters, journals and diaries written by those who fought the battles and those who loved them, each brings new meaning to what the experience was like for the people directly affected and the entire country.

Samuel Henry Brehm, Private, Company E, 130th Regiment of Pennsylvania Volunteers, fought beside his friends and neighbors for the preservation of the Union at Antietam, Fredericksburg, and Chancellorsville in his nine months of service from August 1862 to May 1863.

There is no doubt that Samuel was deeply influenced by the experience and it played an important part in his decision to become a physician after the Great War.
